THIS CORNER WAS RE-REFERENCED WITH PRIOR VERBAL APPROVAL BY ONEIDA COUNTY SURVEYOR MICHAEL ROMPORTL AS RECORD CORNER MONUMENT FOUND DESTROYED IN EXISTING ROADWAY.

This corner was last referenced by John H. Fisher/RLS 836 per U.S. Public Land Survey Monument Location Record dated October 27, 1983 as filed in Oneida County records, which should be referred to for previous historical documentation.

Using Fisher's record ties from his NE Pj BT and SW Pr BT, I could not locate his noted granite monument with iron rod at the corner location in existing gravelled roadway by probing, digging or by MLR detection, so I reset the corner with a standard 2" dia. by 30" long aluminum pipe monument with split bottom end and stamped Oneida County cap to 7" below the South edge of existing gravelled roadway grade.

Fisher's NE and SW BTs had plain blaze markings and an older squareBT sign nailed to upper face; his NE Popple BT is gone. I had to cut into lower face blaze scar of his SW Pr BT in order to reveal original face for measuring record tie distance to corner location.

Field conditions were considered unsuitable for setting iron reference monuments on a right line thru the corner nor for additional BTs other than noted below.

This recovery completed May 17, 2002; there were no direct witnesses.

Unless otherwise indicated, all bearing tree ties are to a .25" dia. by 2.5" long PK nail with a 1.25" dia. steel washer driven into unblazed right face and a .25" dia. by 2.5" long PK nail with a 2" dia. steel washer stamped BT is also driven into unblazed face of bearing tree at DBH; the basis for measured bearings is by compass to nearest degree and all tie distances are measured horizontal by steel tape corrected to nearest 1/100th feet at standard temperature of 68" F.
