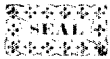

The Field Notes of a Survey of the Island in the northwest quarter of the northeast quarter of Section Eight (8) in Township Thirty-eight (38) North; of Range Eleven (11) East of the Fourth principal Meridian

-----in Wisconsin .

Commencing at the Meander Corner between Sections Five (5) and Eight (8) on the West side of the lake. At this Meander Corner I found the stumps of the two original Hemlock Bearing trees. The marks on them were plain, and they agreed with the original Field Notes.

Thence S. 79 E. 11.20 chains to the auxilliary Meander Corner on the North end of the Island; from which a Birch, 8 inches in diameter bears S. 62½ E. 19½ links distant. No other tree near.

Thence S. 40 E. 1.50 chains.

I commenced the above Survey Jan. 23rd, 1902 and finished it Jan. 24" 1902.

Soil is first rate.

The surface is gently rolling.

and is from three (3) to ten (10) feet above the surface of the lake.

No part of the Island is submerged at any time.

The water between the Island and the mainland is from two (2) to ten (10) feet deep at an ordinary stage of water.

The Island is 7.00 chains from the mainland at the nearest point.

It is all cleared except four (4) small trees, and is in tame grass.

There is an old house on the Island, which is 10 ft x 12 ft. and 8 ft. high - boarded up with rough boards, and probably worth about ten (10) dollars.

The clearing would cost about forty (40) dollars.

The Island is One and one half (1½) miles East of the depot of the C. and N.W.R.R. at Three Lakes, and is worth double what it would be if it were ten (10) miles away.
