 Township 39 North Range 10 East at Principal Meridian
 in Michigan I commenced at the Meander corner (on the
 Town line) between sections 36 and section 1, original
 Platness Tree standing. Used a Guly Field Compass
 with needle (practically new). To determine the
 Variation I sighted to flag at meander foot west
 of over Lake (49 1/2) on the Town line and found the
 Variation to be 5° East: Therefor I determined at 5°
 East and sighted across the Lake to Flag on
 Island #1.

- 44.00 Measured on the ice to Flag and set a Pine
 Post 4 inches square and made the following
