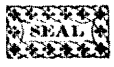

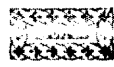

To survey an Island, in Catfish Bay in section 3 in Township 39 North Range 10 East 4th Principal Meridian in Wisconsin I commenced at the Meander corner (on the Town line) between sections 36 and section 1, original Witness Trees standing. I used a Guly Field Compass circle needle (practically new). To determine the Variation I sighted to flag at meander post west of over Lake (49 45), on the Town line and found the Variation to be 5° East: Therefore I set bearing at 5° East and sighted across the Lake to Flag on Island #1.

Course South 68° West.

Measured on the ice to Flag and set a Pine Post 4 inches square and made the following markings: ^{on the same} A. M. C. S. 2. T. 39 N. R. 10 E.,

from which a Black oak stump 8 inches diameter bears South 34° W. 48 links, also marked this stump A. M. C. S. 2. T. 39 N. R. 10 E. B. S. and a few stumps 8 inches diameter bear N. 73° W. 43 links, also marked A. M. C. sec. 2. T. 39 R. 10 E. B. S. Thence South 42° 30' West.
