Value of improvements to date \$75.00. Average depth of water in channel on east side of island is 15 feet and average width of channel on east side of island is 20.00 chains

Average depth of water on west side of island is 20 feet and average width of channel on west side of island is 24.00 chains.

There is a dam on lot 2 in section 30 which when closed raises the water about 6 feet in Squirrel Lake. It has just been closed and water is raising. The flowage from this dam has killed the timber on the shores of lake and island, it has fallen, and the shores are covered with dead timber which makes it exceedingly difficult to get through.

Minocqua is the nearest village and is 13 miles by wagon road from Squirrel Lake. Lac Du- Flambeau is 8 miles from Squirrel Lake but there is no road to go there.

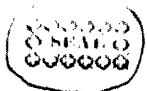
