

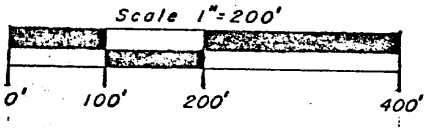
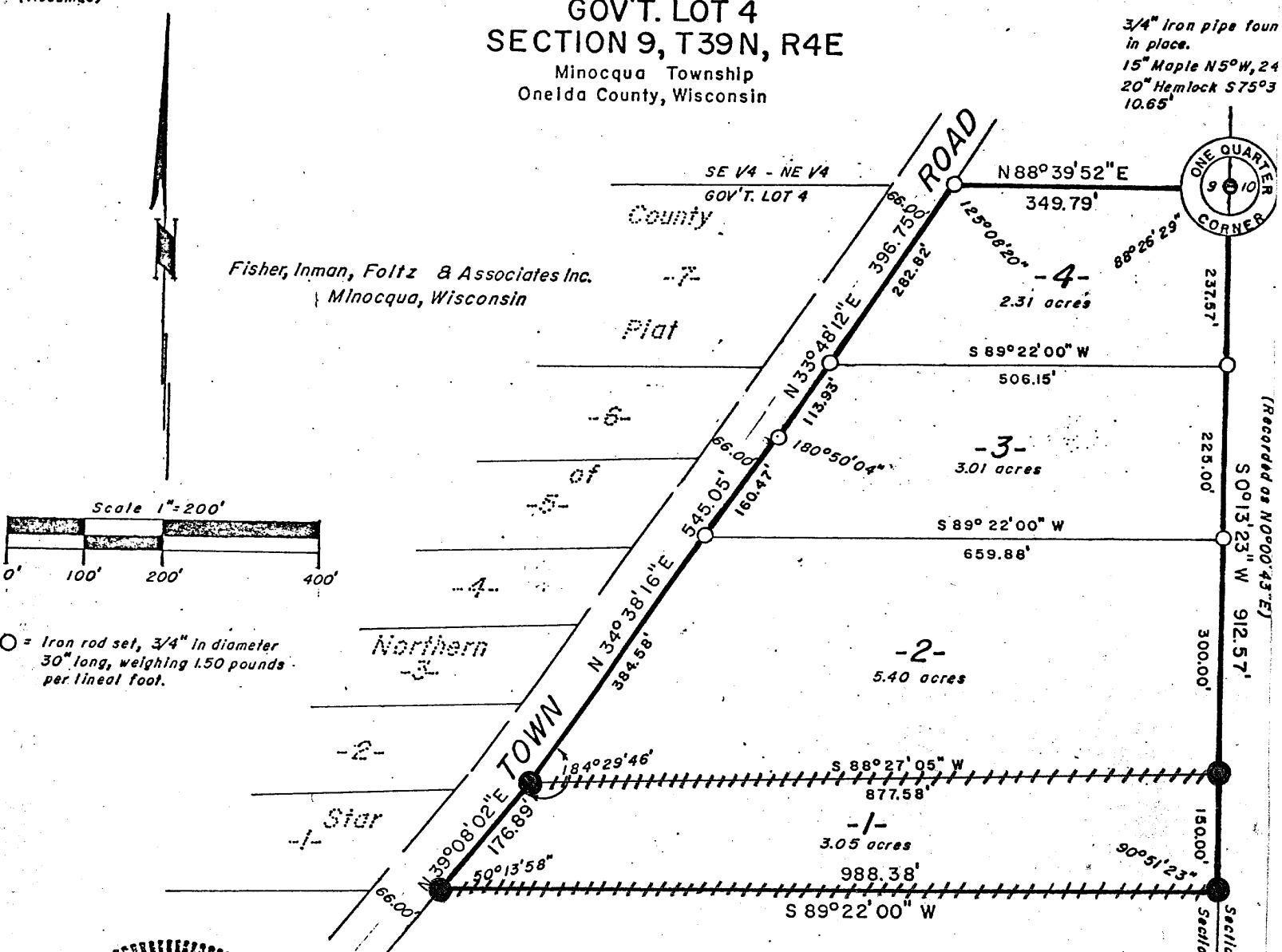

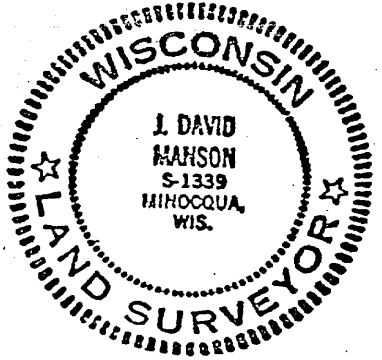

Parcels 1, 2, 3, and 4, being a parcel of land in part of Gov't Lot 4, Section 9, T39N, R4E, Minocqua Township, Oneida County, Wisconsin, more particularly described as follows:

Beginning at the 1/4 corner common to Sections 9 and 10, marked by a 3/4" iron pipe; thence along the Section line S0°13'23"W, 912.57 feet to a 3/4" iron rod; thence S89°22'00"W, 988.38 feet to a 3/4" iron rod on the easterly right of way line of a Town Road; thence along the easterly right of way line of said road N39°08'02"E, 176.89 feet to a 3/4" iron rod, N34°38'16"E, 545.05 feet to a 3/4" iron rod, and N33°48'12"E, 396.75 feet to a 3/4" iron rod on the North line of Gov't Lot 4; thence N88°39'52"E, 349.79 feet along the North line of Gov't Lot 4 to the place of beginning.

Recovered, verified, and marked iron monuments at the corners of Lot 1 as follows:

- = 3/4" iron rod found in place and marked with flagged lath stake.
- //// = Lot lines marked approximately with fluorescent surveyor's flagging ribbon.

This survey was completed for the purpose of locating existing lot corners and flagging approximate lot lines by the order of Phillip Kimball, who has executed a written waiver for all other requirements of Wis. Adm. Code Chap. A-E 7. A closed traverse was not made and the minimum accuracy is 1 part in 100 and plus or minus 2°.
