

A history of surveys is contained in the field notes

This plat represents a dependent resurvey of a portion of the subdivisional lines and original meander lines, designed to restore the corners in their true original locations according to the best available evidence, and the survey of the present meander lines of Lily Lake and Loon Lake in section 22, T 36 N , R 8 E , Fourth Principal Meridian, Wisconsin

The new lottings and acreages shown in section 22 are the result of lands omitted from the original survey. They encompass the areas between the original meander lines, which are recognized now as fixed boundary lines, and the present meander lines of Lily Lake and Loon Lake

Except as shown hereon, the areas are as shown on the plat approved March 18, 1864.
