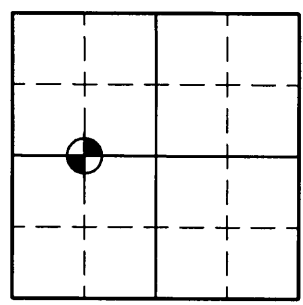
SURVEY LANDMARK PRESERVATION RECORD

April 25, 2005 - Due to road construction Nicolet Surveyors, Inc. was hired by the Oneida County Land Information Office to preserve the location of this survey marker. We found a 3/4" iron pipe in good condition. This corner is shown as a computed position on the Plat of Survey by Thomas Boettcher dated 8/16/1999 - Oneida County Land Information Office Map Number B-4338. This corner lies approximately 70' North of U.S. Highway "8" and 4' South of the Old Highway "8" roadbed and is not in danger of being disturbed due to the road construction.

November 7, 2007 - The Oneida County Land Information Office hired us to go and revisit the corner because the installation of a new power line may have disturbed this corner. We found a 3/4" iron pipe with the top half bent. We replaced it with a 3/4" iron rebar and set witness corners as shown below.

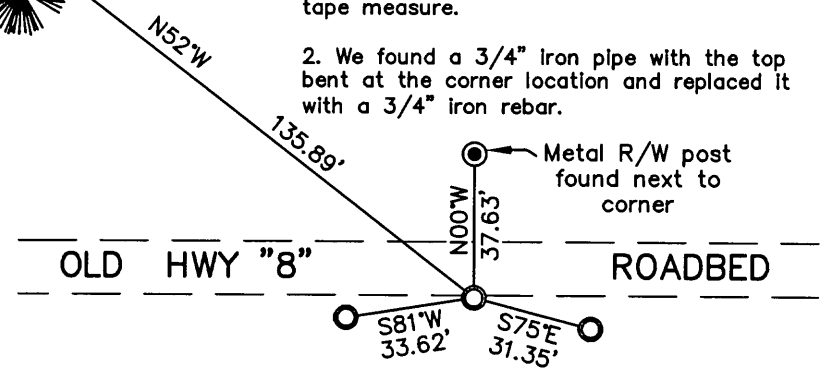
NOTES:

- All bearing were taken with a hand compass and distances measured with a tape measure.
- We found a 3/4" iron pipe with the top bent at the corner location and replaced it with a 3/4" iron rebar.



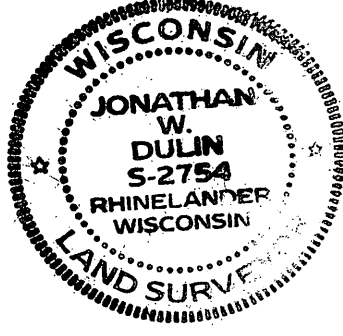
14" Tamarack
