Survey of Lot and Sublots in Sec. 16.

Survey made Aug. 29<sup>th</sup> 1894, with an engineers Transit with a 5 inch circle.

Commencing at the meander corner 9.62 chains East of the corner of Secs. 16, 17, 20 & 21 with the needle adjusted to a variation of 4° 45' East, I ran east and at 38.50 chains fell 42 links north of the meander corner situated 31.82 chains west of the corner of Secs 15, 16, 21 & 22.

- West corrected between Secs 16 & 21 Var 4° 10'
- 31.82 meander corner on lake
  - 41.86 Over lake to small point of land.
  - 47.47 Intersect lake
  - 60.26 Over lake and set meander post.  
Witness Trees { white Pine 12 inches S 35° W 7'  
                  { white Pine 8 " N 58° W 16'
  - 62.08 Intersect lake and set meander Post  
Witness Trees { white Pine 15 inches N 66° E 12.2'  
                  { white Pine 15 " S 63° E 10.0'

Description of Lot 7.

The soil of this lot is 3<sup>d</sup> rate; it is a rocky ridge with steep banks and rises about 20 feet above the lake at the south end: it is timbered with white and Norway Pine and white Birch with a slight growth of underbrush of hazel and alder.

This lot contains  $\frac{231}{1000}$  acres.

Survey of Island Lot No. 8

Commencing at the meander corner 9.62 chains East of the cor. of Secs. 16, 17, 20 + 21, I laid out a Base line N 17° 11' W. 4.545 chains. I then set a picket on the south end of the island. The instrument being set up at the south end of the base line, the picket on the island bears N 67° 15' E: from the north end of the base line the picket bears N 81° 06' E.

I therefore find that the picket is N 67° 15' E 18.79 chains from the meander corner which constitutes the south end of my base line.

I then went to the island and drove a stake 4 inches square and 4 ft long where the picket had stood, for a meander corner: from which a Norway

Pine 9 inches in diameter bears N 8° W 30 ans  
 and a white Pine 14 inches in diameter bears  
 N 7¼° E 31 ans. These trees I marked  
 Lot 8 S. 16. M.C. B.T.

From this corner I then made a  
 meander of the island as follows.

Description of Island Lot 8

The soil of this lot is 3<sup>d</sup> rate: it is  
 from 10 to 25 feet above the lake  
 and has steep banks excepting the  
 west end which is on  
 an easy slope. It is timbered  
 with white pine, red pine,

and before: undergrowth Hazel and  
alder.

This island contains  $\frac{837}{1,000}$  acres.

### Survey of Island Lot No 9.

To commence I set a picket on the east  
end of the island, and then using the  
same base line that I used for  
triangulating to Lot 8, I find that  
with the instrument set up at the  
south end of the base line, the  
picket on the island bears  $N 20^{\circ} 35' E$ :  
from the north end of the base line  
the picket on the island bears  $N 28^{\circ} 44' E$ .  
I therefore find that the picket on the  
island is  $N 20^{\circ} 35' E$ , 23.05 chains from  
the meander corner which constitutes the  
south end of my base line  
I then went to the island and drove  
a stake 3 inches square and four feet  
long, where the picket had stood,  
for a meander corner, from which a  
white Pine Tree 14 inches in diameter bears  
 $S 83\frac{1}{4}^{\circ} W$  46 links. This tree I marked  
Lot 9 p. 16 M.C. B.T.

From this corner I then made a  
meander of the island as follows.
