Survey made April 16th 1894 with a
surveyors compass.

To commence, I set up my compass at
the meander post 7.12 chains south of the
corner of sections 9, 10, 15 & 16, and sighting
across the lake to the meander post
situated 11.39 chains north of the corner
of sections 15, 16, 21 & 22, I found the
magnetic variation to be $0^{\circ}37'$ East
with my compass then adjusted to a
variation of $0^{\circ}37'$ E I ran $S 80\frac{1}{2}^{\circ} W$, and
at 17.00 chains, intersected island and drove
a stake 4 inches square and 4 feet long
for a meander corner, from which a
White Pine Tree 13 inches in diameter bears
 $S 5\frac{1}{2}^{\circ} W$, 99 links, and an Aspen Tree 9 inches
in diameter bears $S 84\frac{1}{4}^{\circ} W$, 94 links. These
trees I marked Lot 9. S. 16. M.C. B.T.

The measurement from the main
shore to the island was made on
the ice, consequently no triangulation.

Description of Island Lot No 9.

The soil of this island is 2^d rate. The northerly part rises to an elevation of about 35 feet, and is covered with a thick growth of small white birch, with a few pine trees. The south 5 acres is cleared and under cultivation. These improvements belong to Geo. Ripley, he has built a log house, about 14 x 20 ft one story high in which he lives.

Survey of Island Lot No 10.

Commencing at the meander post 7.12 chains south of the corner of Sections 9, 10, 15 & 16 with my compass adjusted to a variation of $0^{\circ} 37' E$, I ran $S 65^{\circ} 19' W$ and at 6.90 chains intersected island and drove a stake 4 inches square and $4\frac{1}{2}$ feet long for a meander corner, from which an Aspen Tree 6 inches in diameter bears $S 13^{\circ} W$ $36\frac{1}{2}$ links, and an Aspen Tree 4 inches in diameter bears $S 47^{\circ} W$ 37 links. These trees I marked LOT 10 S. 16. M.C. B.T.

From this meander corner I then made a meander of the island as follows
